

We're Expanding our Impact!

If you have visited our facility in the last few years, you likely noticed the need for a few repairs. Although our facility has served us well over the past 15+ years, a modernization of our space and an expansion of our capabilities is long overdue.

Animal Care League has been growing steadily over the years, and in 2020, we purchased the 1009 Garfield property. This property had been sitting vacant for 10 years, nestled in between our current facility and the 1003 Garfield property, which Animal Care League had purchased several years prior. The purchase of the abandoned 1009 Garfield building was made possible through a partnership with the Cook County Land Bank, and with it, ACL came to own four adjacent properties on Garfield Street. Having these four properties set the stage for us to move forward with plans to build a facility that would increase lifesaving, ensure the physical and emotional health of our animals, and serve as a centrally located resource for the community.

In December of 2021, ACL broke ground and began Phase 1 of a 2-part construction project to transform our facility and our organization.

Construction Phase 1

Phase 1 of the project saw the building of our new adoption center, which will allow us to better foster the human/animal bond and create a more engaging space for our visitors. New adoption suites and meet-and-greet spaces will make it easy for pets and people to connect. The new adoption center's goal is to destigmatize the shelter experience for potential adopters and help more shelter pets find loving homes. Cats, dogs, rabbits, and other small critters will be housed in a low-stress and fun environment. In addition to modern adoption spaces, the new center's community room is perfect for a wide range of events and programming.

Looking to Begin Phase 2

The second phase of construction, which is expected to begin in November, involves renovating our intake, medical, and community resource center. This space will allow us to care for twice as many animals, expand our in-house medical capabilities, revamp our spay/neuter clinic, and utilize proper spaces for isolation and grooming. It will also offer low-stress spaces for animals who may be overwhelmed when entering the shelter. A "real life room" — a home-like space where volunteers can watch movies or work remotely while spending time socializing shy or fearful dogs — will make for another exciting addition to the space. This side of the facility will be designed to promote better health for the animals in our care as

well as offer a safer and more efficient space for staff, volunteers, and our animal control partners.

What to Expect over the Next 8-10 Months

Since ACL will need to remain open during construction, we will be making adjustments to our operations in order to navigate Phase 2 of construction. Soon, we will be moving some of our staff as well as our adoption program over to the completed space. Please be sure to check our website and social media for the most current updates or give us a call to confirm our hours and availability for services. We anticipate hosting a grand opening of the completed facility in 2023.

Capital Campaign

We feel strongly that Oak Park and the surrounding communities deserve to have a more modern animal shelter and pet resource center, and we can only complete this capital project through the generosity and support of these communities. Animal Care League is currently working to raise an initial \$2.25M which will provide significant support towards completing the facility expansion and renovation. Funding will be key to determining the pace of construction, expansion, and programming priorities. We are currently looking for donors who are interested in giving a gift at the \$10,000 or above level.



Making it Count

The Impact of Animal Care League's Medical Fund

This sweet, big-eyed kitty is Jolene (named Plum at ACL), and her relationship with us began at something of an eventful time in her life – when she was found outdoors and brought to the shelter, she was at the tail end of pregnancy. The very next day, one cat had turned into five, and Jolene was a proud, tired mom. While her litter was healthy, and Jolene herself was able to get some much needed rest in a foster home, we soon found out that she wasn't quite out of the woods.

When we saw her next, Jolene was in our clinic for an exam. Her foster owner had noticed that she was having trouble keeping her food down. She was strikingly skinny. We prescribed medication and saw her again two weeks later. Still, Jolene's vomiting persisted, and so to get to the bottom of what was wrong, we ordered an X-ray.

But even the X-ray failed to give us much insight into her condition. With multiple potential diagnoses and only a murky picture of how we could help her, our team was in a tough spot. But although we didn't quite know what to make of Jolene's condition, we knew this curious, sweet, funny cat deserved the best possible chance of a full life. Through all her visits to our clinic and her health troubles, we never saw Jolene's happy spirit waver. We started her on a different medication, sent her home, and waited, hopeful that we would finally see improvement.

After some time on her new meds, Jolene's condition appeared to show signs of stabilizing. We adjusted her diet, and in no time, she was ready to go forward with her spay surgery. With this development, we were able to give Jolene a final diagnosis – a congenital condition known as megaesophagus – and her path to a happy life came into focus at last. After a brief stay in the shelter's front window, where her antics elicited laughs and swoons from passers-by, Jolene got her well-deserved happy ending.

Jolene's path to her forever home wasn't always easy, and it wasn't always certain. But thanks to the invaluable support of ACL's medical fund, we had the resources to never give up on her. We believe every animal deserves a chance like the one Jolene got, but without funding to cover tests, medication, and other medical care, many happy endings like this one simply wouldn't be possible. Donating to the medical fund has a direct impact, not only for animals like Jolene, but for the people who can't imagine life without them.

These days, Jolene is happy and comfortable at home with her sister Dolly, a fellow ACL alum! "She's full of personality," says Jolene's adopter, "and in spite of her special needs, she's quite happy. The vet said that even though she has megaesophagus, she's overall very healthy and has a good quality of life. She is a joy!"

Giving animals a second chance at life, and watching as they spread happiness to the people they meet, is one of the most gratifying parts of what we do. Since 1973, we've been working toward a community where every animal has the best chance possible, and we've seen that work pay off in so many cases like Jolene's.
